
The Balticum Competition

The Balticum Competition is open for documentaries, short and animation films produced in the Baltic Sea countries.

To be eligible for competition, film and TV entries must have been produced no more than two years before the festival - and the director must reside in one of the countries bordering the Baltic Sea. All films must be shown with English subtitles or version and they will be judged by an international jury.

The directors of the selected productions will be invited to present their film at the festival.

> The deadline for entries to the Baltic Sea Forum is the 1st of March.

Admittance is free for projects from the Baltic States, Poland and Russia, as well as directors participating in the film school competition. For projects from other countries a fee of ECU's 150 must be paid. Information about the procedure can be obtained from Baltic Media Centre.
